e) Synchronized Skating

- i) In an event with two Free Skating programs the Total Segment Score for the first Free Skate is multiplied by what factor?
- ii) If more than one skater falls in a Senior Open event, what deduction will apply for each fall?
- iii) How many times can a bonus be obtained for an innovative element, movement or transition?

 - e) You have been given a list of the entries for each of the categories. There are two other pieces of information will you require before you can proceed with the paper work. What are they?
 - f) You will need to arrange a time and place to do the initial draws. What are the two types of draws that will take place?
 - g) How many entries from each of the Junior categories can qualify to the Challenge BMO Skate Canada Eastern or Western Challenge?
 - h) Who is responsible to ensure that the referees have all the necessary report forms?
 - i) Because the competition will take place in two different arenas, it is not possible for you to act as the Chief Data Specialist in both places. What action will you take to ensure appropriate coverage and accountability in the arena where you cannot be present during the competition?
 - j) Both the start orders and the results for all of the categories must be posted at the three arenas. What form of communication do you think would be the most efficient to ensure that all of the postings were made available in a timely fashion at the different arenas?
 - k) What is the name of the document which governs protests using CPC?
 - l) What is a Field of Play Decision?
