General

This competition is being held under the current rules of the Skate Canada Official Rulebook (revised 2000) and any amendments thereto which became effective after that date. The nature of the Event is defined in the Skate Canada Technical Handbook. The Host Committee reserves the right to alter (with the exception of Section “A” CanSkate Challenge Element Event) the overall procedures to be followed during any part of the competition, if such alteration is considered to be in the best interest of the skaters or the Association. The Technical Representative, Chief Referee, or Senior Referee present will be the agent of the Association in such an instance.

Eligibility

- All skaters must be eligible persons as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 2100.
- All Skaters must be Associate members in good standing of the Association.
- Competitors wishing to enter shall have passed the appropriate badges/test qualifications for relevant events by **DECEMBER 1, 2011.**
- All age requirements are as of **DECEMBER 1, 2011.**
- All skaters must provide a photocopy of proof of age (birth certificate, baptismal certificate or passport) with their completed entry form for events in which eligibility or categories are dependent upon the competitor’s age.

Entry Forms

- Entry forms, including all required supporting documentation, **must be completed in FULL** or they will not be processed and returned.
- All entry forms must be received by **CHRISTA SMITH**, with entry fees and supporting documentation where required, no later than **DECEMBER 9, 2011** regardless of postmark or courier date.
- Faxed or telephone entries will not be accepted.

Event Specifications

Skaters are permitted to “skate up” one level – they can enter an event one level above the level they are actually qualified to skate, and may enter one of these levels or both.

Entry fees are payable with the entry form.

- Post-dated cheques will not be accepted.
- A separate cheque and entry form is required for each event. Additional copies of the entry form may be photocopied.
- Entry form(s), entry fees, and acceptable proof of age where relevant, must be received no later than **DECEMBER 9, 2011** regardless of postmark or courier date.

Returned Cheques

A \$25.00 administration fee will be applied to cheques returned by your bank. The amount of the returned cheque and the \$25.00 administration fee must be paid in cash or by a certified cheque, bank draft, money order or similar form of guaranteed payment prior to the skater being permitted to compete.

NOTE: No skater will skate until all money owing, including charges for NSF cheques, is properly paid upon registration at the arena on the day of the competition.

Refunds and Withdrawals

- Refunds will be given for any cancelled events or if the entry is withdrawn prior to **DECEMBER 9, 2011**
- After **DECEMBER 9, 2011** refunds will be given for medical reasons only, providing the Competition Registrar is notified of the medical withdrawal prior to the start of the event and if the Registrar receives a medical certificate by **FEBRUARY 22, 2012**.
- An administration fee of \$25.00 per event will be charged for medical withdrawals

Cancellation of Events

- Entries will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis once all required information and fees have been received.
- Faxed or telephone entries will not be accepted.
- Late entries will be accepted at the discretion of the Technical Representative.
- An event will be cancelled if only one skater has entered. Entry fees will be refunded if an event is cancelled.
- No Exhibitions
- The Technical Representative may combine two or more categories in the same event when each category has fewer than three entries or one category has insufficient entries to hold the event. In each case, the categories may only be combined with full prior knowledge and agreement of all competitors affected.
- The Technical Representative reserves the right to categorize flights & limit the number of entries in any event.

Protective Equipment – Helmet Policy

As of July 1st, 2011 Skate Canada issued a policy statement as follows “All Skate Canada member clubs and skating schools **must** ensure that participants up to and including Stage 5 wear a CSA approved hockey helmet while on the ice – this policy **must** be enforced during competitions”

Registration

Skaters are to register at least one hour prior to the scheduled start of his/her event.

The Host Committee reserves the right to start an event up to one-half hour prior to its scheduled start time.

Coaches

All Coaches must be prepared to show and wear their Skate Canada photo ID.

Marking

The results for "Section A" Events will be determined as per the Skate Canada recommendations for their CanSkate Challenge Element Event. Certificates will be provided for this part of the competition.

The Results for "Section B" will be determined using the One by One [OBO] system. Result sheets will not be available for sale.

Awards

- Medals/or Ribbons and LTAD Certificates will be presented in accordance with the regulations set out in the Skate Canada Event Management Handbook. No medals will be awarded for exhibitions.

General Admission Tickets may be purchased at the event.

- Chaperone passes **will not** be provided.
- Adult - **\$4.00** Senior/Student - **\$3.00** Children (6 and under) - FREE
- Programs: **\$2.00**

Accidents/Liability

Skate Canada Rule 7000 B 1.11 will apply.

Skate Canada - Eastern Ontario, the Clubs/Organizers of any competition, and the Volunteer Team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries therein, all competitors and their parents, or guardians, shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, caused by or connected with the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the Association, the Section, the Clubs/Organizers, and the Volunteer Team holding the competition and against their officers, and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

CAMERA & VIDEO POLICY:

1. An authorized videotaping service will be available for the purchase of a DVD.
2. Ticket holders are permitted to use cameras or video cameras at an event for personal use ONLY. Taping of entire flights and/or events is not permitted. The camera's lens must not be larger than 200mm.
3. STRICTLY PROHIBITED:
 - Videotaping of complete events
 - Flash photography
 - Any resale of photography or videos by ticket holders

1. Individuals will need prior approval to attend and photograph skaters at Section Partnered events. Individuals will be given access to the boards near the skaters' entry to the ice. Accredited individuals will not interfere with coach/skater communications during warm-up periods. Pictures of skater and/or coaches will not be allowed prior to or after the performance. Any written complaints of interference will result in the loss of accreditation for future events.

2. The following is a guideline for approving accreditation:
 - Individuals from News media must submit appropriate accreditation for review.
 - An individual representing skating club parent must submit written permission from these parents with request
 - Pictures of skaters will not be made available for sale.

Directions to Arena

Wellington is located along Hwy-33 on the north shore of Lake Ontario, approx. 25 km south of Belleville and approx. 195 km east of Toronto.

From the West (Toronto): Don Valley Pkwy. north approx. 14 km to Hwy-401 Express East. Proceed east on Hwy-401 Express approx. 23 km to Hwy-401 East. Continue east on Hwy-401 approx. 123 km to Wooler Rd./CR-40 (exit 522). Turn right on Wooler Rd./CR-40 and proceed south approx. 6 km to Hwy-33 (Loyalist Pkwy). Continue south on Hwy-33 (Loyalist Pkwy) approx. 31 km to Belleville St./CR-2 in Wellington. Turn left on Belleville St./CR-2 and proceed north approx. 0.5 km to arena on the right.

From the East (Kingston): Hwy-401 west approx. 50 km to Marysville Rd./Hwy-49 (exit 566). Turn left on Marysville Rd./Hwy-49 and proceed south approx. 28 km to Hwy-33 (Loyalist Pkwy). Continue on Loyalist Pkwy./Hwy-33 approx. 17.5 km (becomes Wellington St.) to Belleville St./CR-2 in Wellington. Turn right on Belleville St. and proceed north approx. 0.5 km to arena on the right.

TECHNICAL INFORMATION – SECTION “A”

CANSKATE CHALLENGE ELEMENT EVENT

This CanSkate Challenge Element Event pilot initiative was developed by Skate Canada in support of the organization’s on-going implementation of the *Long Term Athlete Development Model*. The event has been formatted to recognize the philosophies of the *Learn to Skate* stage which aims to provide skaters with the opportunity to showcase their skills in a fun and interactive environment. The focus of the event is on individual skill improvement and therefore performances are not ranked. Instead of the traditional podium presentations for first, second and third, all skaters will receive a certificate indicating their overall performance level award (Gold, Silver, Bronze or Merit). The award level will be based on the assessment of four individual elements. Each element is evaluated using three pre-determined performance standards. Your skater will receive a full overview of their performance on the scoring standards chart which will be provided along with their award certificate.

3	Stage 6* (Figure): Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 5 badge, but not the complete Stage 6 badge.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fast fwd perimeter stroking (draw for direction) • Turning on a curve fwd to bwd changing feet (RFI-LBI or RFI-RBI)(Mohawk) • One-foot spin with FO spiralling edge entry (either the #4 style or corkscrew position) • Rotating power jump (waltz jump)
4	Stage 6* (Hockey): Skaters must have passed the complete Stage 5 badge, but not the complete Stage 6 badge.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fast fwd perimeter stroking (draw for direction) • Fast bwd perimeter stroking (draw for direction) • Turning on a curve fwd to bwd changing feet (RFI-LBI or LFI-RBI)(Mohawk) • Fwd two-foot side stop with speed (skater’s choice of direction)

TECHNICAL INFORMATION – SECTION “B”

The events offered in this Section of the Announcement will be run as in previous years, with a judging panel and Technical Representative – either medals and or /ribbons will be given for a skater’s placement in each event.

CANSKATE INDIVIDUAL ELEMENTS

All skaters in each flight will be on the ice at the same time. Each skater in turn will perform each element in rotation with the other skaters in the order listed below. Coaches will be permitted to work with their skaters only during warm-up. No re-skates will be permitted.

8	Introductory Individual Elements Must not have passed any complete Skate Canada Test or any part of the Preliminary Freeskate Test.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Salchow • Backward outside full edges • Backward Spiral • Forward one-foot spin with backward crosscut entry (minimum two (2) rotations).

CANSKATE PROGRAM FORMAT ELEMENTS

Movements are confined to those listed and can be done in any order. Movements must be continuous using connecting moves necessary to link the various elements. No music will be used. Judging will be based on technical merit only. If necessary, only half the ice surface will be used and these events will be double-paneled. Maximum time for the completion of the required elements is 1 minute. Coaches may work with their skaters during the warm-up. Skaters will be divided into age categories when numbers warrant.

CANSKATE TEAM ELEMENTS

Elements will be done in isolation. Coaches may work with their teams during warm-up only for Introductory Team Elements. Coaches may work with the Stage Team Elements during the competition. There will be NO re-skates allowed. All teams will be out on the ice for warm up. All skaters skate one lap around the rink then take position by the boards. The announcer will then call the elements one by one to be practiced. When all elements have been practiced, the competition will begin. Teams must have 2 skaters minimum and 4 maximum. Elements skated in order shown.
