### GENERAL INFORMATION

---

The Eastern Ontario STARSkate Invitational Championship will be held on **February 24-26, 2012** at:

**Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre**  
265 Cannifton Road, Belleville, ON

This Championship is open to any eligible skater who is a member in good standing with Skate Canada as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book, and whose Home Club is located in the Eastern Ontario Section.

The Championships will be conducted in accordance with the regulations as set forth in the Skate Canada Rulebook. If not specifically stated otherwise in this document, the normal regulations governing skating will apply as indicated in Section 4000 and 7000 of the Skate Canada Rulebook, the Technical and Event Management Handbooks, the Policies and Procedures Manual and CPC Regulations.

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION - DEADLINE FOR ENTRIES

- Registration may be limited if entries exceed the amount of ice time available.
- Regardless of which type of payment option is used - Entry Forms will be accepted on a first serve basis, therefore skaters should register as soon as possible
- Entry Forms & Fees, including any required supporting documentation, must be completed in FULL or they will not be processed and will be returned
- **All Entry Forms must be received no later than 4:00 pm on Friday, January 13, 2012 regardless of postmark, courier date, or, if using PayPal, scanned (email) or Fax** – it is important to note that once the deadline date & time has been reached PayPal will be closed down for this event on the EO Website.
- A separate Entry Form must be completed for each event
- **Payment through PayPal without completing the applicable Entry Form is NOT considered a registration.**
- Entry Forms along with a cheque or money order and proof of age (if applicable) may be mailed or couriered as has been the standard. **\*\* Entry Forms & proof of age (if applicable) may be faxed only if PayPal is used as the payment option**
- Late entries will not be accepted

### MAKE CHEQUES PAYABLE TO - EOSIC 2012

#### CANCELLATION OF AN EVENT

A competition shall be held if there are at least two entries. If there is only one entry in a qualifying event (an event that advances to 2012 Trillium STARSkate Championships), skaters will be expected to skate an exhibition for monitoring purposes, and pay half of the entry fee

#### RETURNED CHEQUES

**A \$25.00 administration fee will be charged for each NSF or cheques returned as non-cashable.** The amount of the original returned cheque and the \$25.00 administration fee must be paid in cash or by a certified cheque, bank draft, money order, or similar form of guaranteed payment prior to the skater being permitted to compete.



#### REFUNDS AND WITHDRAWALS

Entries withdrawn **prior to January 13, 2012** will be given full refunds. A full refund will also be given if an event is cancelled. **After January 13, 2012**, refunds will be granted only for withdrawals for medical reasons and then only if the Host Committee is notified of such medical withdrawals prior to the start of the event and provided a medical certificate is received by the Competition Registrar by March 2, 2012. An administration fee of \$25.00 per event to a maximum of \$50.00 per person, dance, or pair team will be charged.

## COACH ACCREDITATION

---

Coaches must be a minimum of NCCP Primary STARSkate Coach Certified and must meet the following accreditation standards:

- be a current professional coaching member of Skate Canada
- hold a valid First Aid Certificate

Coaches must register in person and show their photo ID card.

## REGISTRATION

---

All competitors and coaches must register at the Quinte Sports & Wellness Centre at least one hour prior to the start of their event. Please be aware that during the Competition Weekend events may start up to one-half hour earlier than the start time indicated on the Schedule.

## AWARDS

---

Medals will be presented in accordance with the Skate Canada Event Management Handbook. No medals are awarded for exhibitions. **Skaters must be in skating attire and skates for presentations.**

## TONI CARR BURSARY

---

Toni Carr was a member of the Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario Board of Directors for twenty years (1987-2007) and for four years was the Section Chair (1997-2001). In addition, Toni was a Skate Canada Judge (singles & dance) as well as an Evaluator (Freeskate, dance & skating skills). In her role as an administrator/volunteer and as a judge/evaluator, Toni's primary interest was the development of young skaters in the Eastern Ontario Section and she contributed much of her time, energy and skills to ensure skaters would have opportunities that would help them develop to their maximum potential. In Toni's memory and in recognition of her special interest in the Section's test skaters, the Board of Directors of Skate Canada-Eastern Ontario has established four (4) bursaries for skaters who compete at the Eastern Ontario STARSkate Invitational Championship (EOSIC). A bursary in the amount of \$250.00 will be awarded to the first-place finish in each of four (4) categories – Junior Bronze Men, Junior Bronze Women, Senior Bronze Men and Senior Bronze Women - provided there is a minimum of three (3) skaters who compete in the respective categories. The Bursaries will be forwarded to the recipients after the close of the competition.

## ACCIDENTS

---

Rule 7000 B (1.11) will apply. "The Association and the clubs or organizers of any competition undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by the skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries therein, all competitors and their parents, or guardians, shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks of injury to the competitor's person and property resulting from, caused by or connected with the conduct and management of the competition and to release any and all claims which they may have against the officials, the Association and the clubs or organizers holding the competition and against their officer, and their entries shall only be accepted on this condition."



## CAMERA & VIDEOS POLICY

---

1. An authorized videotaping service will be available for the purchase of a DVD.
2. Ticket holders are permitted to use cameras or videos cameras at an event for personal use ONLY. Taping of entire flights and/or events is not permitted. The camera's lens must not be larger than 200mm.
3. STRICTLY PROHIBITED:
  - Videotaping of complete events
  - Flash photography
  - Any resale of photography or videos by ticket holders

- Individuals will need prior approval to attend and photograph skaters at Section Partnered events. Individuals will be given access to the boards near the skaters' entry to the ice. Accredited individuals will not interfere with coach/skater communications during warm-up periods. Pictures of skater and/or coaches will not be allowed prior to or after the performance. Any written complaints of interference will result in the loss of accreditation for future events.
- The following is a guideline for approving accreditation:
  - Individuals from News media must submit appropriate accreditation for review.
  - An individual representing skating club parent (s) must submit written permission from the parent (s) with the request.
  - Pictures of skaters will not be made available for sale.

### **WELL BALANCED PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS**

---

Programs should meet the Well Balanced Program Criteria as outlined in the 2011-2012 Skate Canada STARSkate Pre-Event Technical Package. Criteria may be found on the Skate Canada ([www.skatecanada.ca](http://www.skatecanada.ca)) and the Skate Canada – Eastern Ontario ([www.skate-eos.on.ca](http://www.skate-eos.on.ca) "Technical Info") websites.

### **MUSIC REQUIREMENTS**

---

*All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies.*

*Competitors, who have music composed especially for their program either wholly or in part, shall be responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.*

**Registration of Music** – Music must be turned in at the time of registration. Cassettes, CD's and their cases must have the competitor's name and event clearly printed on them. Competitors will be responsible for picking up their own music at the completion of their event.

**Dance Music** – For the information of Dance competitors, 2001 Skate Canada Series 8 music (or ISU music when applicable) will be used for all compulsory dance events.

**Music Requirements** – Each entry *must provide 2 cassettes or CDs* for the Competition upon registration. One for competition (marked "MASTER") and one for backup (marked "COPY"). If 2 CDs are provided, it is recommended that a back-up cassette be available.

### **Standard Specifications for Cassettes and CDs**

- Only one (1) program shall be recorded on each cassette or CD.
- The start of the music shall be recorded on the tape or CD at least 3 seconds following the head leader and not more than 5 seconds.
- Music shall be recorded at equal levels on both left and right channels in stereo.
- Competitor's name followed by music time (not skating time) shall be clearly printed on side one of the cassette or CD.
- Each cassette or CD shall be enclosed in its plastic container marked with the skater's name, event and total music time.
- Music recording levels shall be a maximum of OVU and a minimum of -8VU.
- For optimum playback of the music recorded on CDs it is recommended that the music be recorded (written) to the CD in either Compact Disc Audio (CDA) or Wave file (wav) format. Music recorded in MP3 or I-Tune format may not play from the EO music playback equipment.

## ***PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT SHEETS***

---

Planned Program Content Sheets are required for Pre-Juvenile Events as well as STARSkate Junior Bronze, Senior Bronze, Junior Silver, Senior Silver and Gold including the Freeskate portion of the Triathlon Events and **MUST BE** handed in on the weekend of the event to the **Music Registration Desk** prior to the start of the event. Skaters should also expect to submit a 'new' planned Program content sheet when qualifying on to a semi-final and/or final and this should also be handed in at the **Music Registration Desk** prior to the start of the event. Planned Program Sheets can be filled in 'on-line' on the Section Website – <http://www.skate-eos.on.ca/competitions.html> – once completed they can be printed and brought to the Registration Desk on the day of the event.

## ***ELIGIBILITY RULES - EOSIC***

---

- Be eligible person(s) as defined in Skate Canada Rule Book Section 2100 (Rule 5401).
- Be Associate member(s) in good standing of the Association (Rule 5401).
- For eligibility in a Sectional STARSkate competition, please note the following restrictions:  
**COMPETITIVE SKATERS:** Skaters registered to compete in any event at the Novice or higher level

at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition, do not qualify to compete in the Sectional STARSkate Championships in any category at any level. Skaters registered to compete in the Juvenile and Pre-Novice level at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition may register to compete in event categories at the STARSkate level other than those competed in at a Sectional or Sectional qualifying competition. Please see the table below for the qualifications for entry.

**For purposes of interpretation of this regulation, registration for a Sectional or qualifying event is defined as the submission of a registration form for such event.**

- **WINNER OF A PREVIOUS TRILLIUM STARSkate Event:** A previous winner of a Trillium STARSkate category is **NOT eligible** to re-enter the same category.
- **TRILLIUM STARSKATE CHAMPIONSHIPS** – to qualify for Trillium STARSkate Championships, competitors must place 1st, 2nd or 3rd in all STARSkate Free Skating categories (Junior Bronze thru Gold), Triathlon categories (Bronze, Silver and Gold), STARSkate Dance categories (Junior Bronze thru Diamond) or Pair category (open only). Any fourth place skaters or teams must also register as Alternate
- **PRE-JUVENILE QUALIFYING TO TRILLIUM STARSKATE CHAMPIONSHIPS** - to qualify for Trillium STARSkate Championships, competitors in the Pre-Juvenile events must place 1st, 2nd or 3rd in Pre-Juvenile singles, dance or pair categories. The fourth place skater must also register as the Alternate.
- If a competitor cannot compete at the Provincial Championship, the next placed skater may be entered in order of placing until the place is filled.
- Registration of the top three EOSIC competitors in each event (including 4<sup>th</sup> place alternate) will take place at the arena on the weekend of the event.
- **TEST AND AGE PREREQUISITES:** All Competitors (STARSkate & Pre-Juvenile) wishing to enter the 2012 Eastern Ontario STARSkate Invitational Championships (EOSIC) and events leading to it shall meet the test requirements to compete **AS OF November 15, 2011** preceding the competition. Age requirements shall be met as noted below preceding the competition.
  - STARSkate Categories – No Age Requirements
  - Pre-Juvenile Categories – Age Requirement as of July 1, 2011
- Wherever eligibility for an event is specified in terms of a test, it shall mean the complete test.

NOTE: Skaters may "skate-up" in the Freeskate & Dance categories only.

PRE-JUVENILE SKATERS: Pre-Juvenile skaters may only compete in the Pre-Juvenile event of the same discipline. They may not enter any other STARSkate event in the same discipline.

- **COMPETITIVE SINGLES TEST EQUIVALENCIES IN THE STARSkate PROGRAM:** As regulation 4000 –E – 3.1 states, skaters passing free skating tests in the competitive test system are granted equivalencies for regular free skating tests as follows:

Competitive Singles Test	STARSkate Test Equivalent
Juvenile Competitive Singles Test	Junior Silver Free Skating Test
Pre-Novice Competitive Singles Test	Senior Silver Free Skating Test
Novice Competitive Singles Test	Gold Free Skating Test
Junior or Senior Competitive Singles Test	Gold Free Skating Test

Skaters who have passed any of the competitive test equivalencies must enter the STARSkate Championships at the level corresponding to their highest STARSkate test passed or at the level which they received the equivalency in the STARSkate Program, whichever is higher.

- Skaters may participate in either the 2012 Eastern Ontario STARSkate Invitational Championships (EOSIC) or the 2012 Adult Figure Skating Championships, but not both.
- Entrants in the Triathlon events must register to compete in the highest level that their test qualification qualifies them for. For example, a skater who has passed the Senior Silver Skating Skill, Bronze Interpretive and Senior Silver Free Skate must compete in Silver Triathlon and cannot skate in Bronze Triathlon.
- **Composition of Partners:** Couples for Pair and Dance Events must be comprised of one woman and one man. Each individual in the partnership must satisfy all eligibility requirements.

#### TEST& AGE REQUIREMENTS:

STARSkate Categories – No Age Requirements – Test Requirements as of November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011

7. Gold Free Skating	May have passed the Gold Free skate test.

### STARSKATE PAIR EVENT

Programs must meet all technical details including test requirements, prerequisites, program time specifications and the Well Balanced Program Criteria for the categories to be skated as outlined in the Skate Canada STARSkate Pre-Event Technical Package for 2011-2012. #### TEST& AGE REQUIREMENTS:

### **STARSKATE DANCE EVENT**

Programs must meet all technical details including test requirements, prerequisites, program time specifications and the Well Balanced Program Criteria for the categories to be skated as outlined in the Skate Canada STARSkate Pre-Event Technical Package for 2011-2012. The said Criteria may be found on the Skate Canada ([www.skatecanada.ca](http://www.skatecanada.ca)) and the Skate Canada – Eastern Ontario ([www.skate-eos.on.ca](http://www.skate-eos.on.ca) - "Technical Info") websites.

#### **TEST & AGE REQUIREMENTS:**

STARSkate Categories – No Age Requirements – Test Requirements as of November 15<sup>th</sup>, 2011  
Dances are to be skated in the order listed. The number of dance patterns to be skated shall be the same as for Evaluated Tests. Please refer to the Skate Canada Technical Handbook Figure Skating Terms Defined – 3.15 (2). Also, please note that dances are to be started such that the first pattern of the dance is on the judges' side of the ice surface.

Dance teams must be composed of one woman and one man. The 2001 Skate Canada Series 8 music (or ISU music when applicable) will be used for all compulsory dance events

*Please Note: Two (2) sequences are required for each Dance EXCEPT where indicated otherwise.*

<b>9. Preliminary Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Preliminary Dance test and not the complete junior bronze dance test
<b>10. Junior Bronze Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Junior Bronze Dance test and not the complete senior bronze dance test
<b>11. Senior Bronze Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Senior Bronze Dance test and not the complete junior silver dance test
<b>12. Junior Silver Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Junior Silver Dance test and not the complete senior silver dance test
<b>13. Senior Silver Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Senior Silver Dance test and not the complete gold dance test
<b>14. Gold Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Gold Dance test and not the complete diamond dance test
<b>15. Diamond Dance</b>	At least one (1) partner must have passed the complete Diamond Dance test



**STARSKATE TRIATHLON EVENT**

Programs must meet all technical details including test requirements, prerequisites, program time specifications and the Well Balanced Program Criteria for the categories to be skated as outlined in the Skate Canada STARSkate Pre-Event Technical Package for 2011-2012. Triathlon events are multi-part singles events that highlight the diverse programs that singles skaters can complete in the STARSkate program. At each level there are three parts to the event. The specifications for each part have been outlined in "Part A" (Free Skate), "Part B" (Skating Skills) and "Part C" (Interpretive) in the 2011/2012 Skate Canada STARSkate Competition Technical Package. These criteria may be found on the Skate Canada ([www.skatecanada.ca](http://www.skatecanada.ca)) members only and the "Technical Info" page of the Skate Canada – Eastern Ontario ([www.skate-eos.on.ca](http://www.skate-eos.on.ca)) website.

Test Prerequisite: Must have passed at least two of the following tests: Gold Free Skate test, and/or Gold Skating Skills test and/or Gold Interpretive test

*\*Entrants must register to compete in the highest Triathlon level that their test qualifications qualify them for.*
