



CONDITIONS FOR GRANTING A SANCTION & NON-SANCTION EVENT

EVENT SANCTION

Any event, carnival, or exhibition - open to the public or to club/ skating school members only.

FORM:: "Application for Event Sanction"

A Section sanction will be required:

- If an admission fee is charged
- Participants include eligible and /or ineligible persons
- Financial benefit accrues to the organizers and/or participants

NON-SANCTIONED EVENT

Any event that could include but not restricted to... hockey games, municipal events, media appearances (except local coverage), ice shows, competitions, photo shoots (commercial ventures, catalogues, magazines, calendars, etc), or film production.

FORM: "Application for Eligible Members Permission to Participate in a Non-Sanctioned Event"

A Sectional sanction is required if:

- The skater (s) is invited to participate in a exhibition at a non-sanctioned event (see above)
- The skater (s) is invited to participate in a media appearance or appearance in a commercial venture.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

Conditions

- Letter of permission from the home club of the guest skater (s) must be obtained by the sanctioned club/ skating school and attached to the Sanction request.
- A non-refundable administration fee of \$25.00 must accompany each Sanction request.
- A penalty fee of \$50.00 will be applied in addition to the normal fee for the Event Sanction if the application is not received 13 days prior to the event, as per Skate Canada rule 2206 (10.5)
- A Skate Canada sanction is required if:
 - A National Team Member Skater is invited to participate in an event. An application is available from Skate Canada.

Time Limit

- All sanctions are valid for a specified performance or appearance only
- Where an Event is being repeated on the same ice, the sanction may cover all performances given over a period of seven (7) consecutive days (Sundays included). A new sanction will be required for any extension beyond the seven (7) days.

AGREEMENT OF APPLICANTS APPLYING FOR THE SANCTION RULE 2206 (11.0)

In applying for the Sanction the applicants agree to:

- They are aware of all Association rules covering the event
- They will abide by all such rules
- They will be liable for payment of applicable fees
- They will carry out all instructions that they may receive from the Association regarding the Sanctioned event.
- That no responsibility or claim for damages or losses, financial or otherwise shall lie against the Association, its officers or members by reason of a sanction of sanctions being granted, partly granted or not granted by the Association.
- That every program, folder, and advertisement shall state in a prominent place, preferably the front cover of title page, that the event is "sanctioned by Skate Canada – Eastern Ontario". If the Sanction has been approved directly by Skate Canada then it should state "sanctioned by Skate Canada".
- That for events or activities conducted by non-member organizations, the Association reserves the right to require that a bond issued by a recognized bonding company, in the amount felt necessary, be posted to guarantee the fulfillment of all agreements.
- The Section shall be entitled to have an official representative in attendance without charge at any sanctioned event or activity.

DEFINITIONS

Exhibitions: defined as brief performances by a skater or group of skaters in connection with some event or form of entertainment other than a Carnival.

Carnival: defined as performances in which skating provides the principal part of the entertainment.

Simulations: defined as Skaters performing in simulation competitive environment and receive feedback from judges and technical specialists

Media Appearances: defined as appearances on television, radio, film or other publicity channels.

Commercial Ventures: defined as any activity or appearance made on behalf of a commercial organization whose motivation for activity or appearance is financial gain.
